



### DIRECTIONS

Follow Gerry Sorensen Way from the downtown lights past the ski hill and around the big switchback. Turn left onto N Star Drive and follow it past another switchback to the end.



### TRAILS AND GROOMING

Trails are designed to provide enjoyable skiing using state-of-the-art grooming equipment. The trail network includes:

- Double-wide skate and classic trails for recreational to competitive skiers, groomed using a Prinoth snowcat with tiller, dual track setter, and full-width xc ski comb.
- Single-track classic trails for those seeking solitude, groomed using a Ginzu towed behind a snowmobile.
- Grooming equipment is GPS tracked for realtime reporting on our website.
- A network of adventure trails for snowshoeing and summer mountain biking.
- Major trails are covered with wood chips for excellent early and late season skiing.
- Recently rebuilt trails have been approved to current race standards for 3.3 km, 3.75 km, 5 km loops, and 750 m and 1300 m sprint loops.

### FACILITIES

- Full-service day lodge with complete kitchen, washrooms, couches, tables, and chairs for cosy après ski chats or gatherings of family & friends.
- Lodge is available for rental outside of peak times.
- Wood stove is always lit and complimentary hot chocolate, coffee and tea are always available.
- Nearby waxing hut is available for ski preparation.

### PROGRAMS AND EVENTS

- Scheduled programs are available for Jackrabbits (4-9), Track Attack (9-13), Nordic Racers (13-19), Biathlon (9+) and Masters (19+).
- Individual ski lessons are offered by certified CANSI instructors on an individual or group basis.
- Ski at School program introduces students to skiing.
- New Year's Eve Torchlit Ski fundraiser.
- Kootenay Cup Races attract hundreds of competitors of all ages and abilities each year.

### RULES AND ETIQUETTE

During operational months, enjoy the trails by following these rules and etiquette guidelines:



Wear your pass in a visible place while skiing.



Obey directional signs and keep to the right on two way trails.



Overtaking skiers should step out of the track to pass. Say, "On your left/right!"



Downhill skiers have the right of way.



Only ski sleds with rigid attachments allowed.



Please don't litter! If you pack it in, pack it out.

Recreational cross country skiing has a rich 50 year history on North Star Mountain. Today these historic trails form the foundation of a modern ski facility with trails and amenities to please all levels.

The Kimberley Nordic Club (KNC) is a registered not-for-profit, full service ski club whose goal is fostering nordic skiing as an affordable, life-long winter activity. The club is one of the largest in BC and a premiere cross country facility that features:

- A modern lodge with washrooms and a ski-specific dryland training space
- A heated waxing hut
- 25 km of groomed double track trails
- 6 km of single track trails
- 3.3 km lit loop for night skiing
- Ski rentals, wax and ski accessories

## VISITOR GUIDE AND TRAIL MAP

### EASY INTRO

Our most popular loop is the 3km lit loop. Skied clockwise, Centennial trail rolls along with views of the Rockies. Past Iker's Landing, the gradual climb on Spruce takes you into a protected valley. The finish is a slight downhill back to the stadium. This loop is especially magical by torchlight on New Year's Eve.

### MOVING INTO MODERATES

Those looking for a longer ski will enjoy a loop of the Snowbird trail. A good destination on this loop is Sunshine Corner, a perfect picnic spot with a large table. There is a choice of finishes, the easiest along Trapline. Landsem climbs moderately onto a bench, and Larch Loop ascends far above the rest of the trails.

### BEST VIEWPOINT

The long climb up Larch Loop is rewarded with a dramatic view across to the Rockies. This area is also home to some of the tallest Larch trees in BC.

### KIDS MAGIC

Kids love the hidden world at the base of two giant trees near Iker's Landing. To find it, veer right onto the Hill Bypass at the start of Spruce trail.

### SECLUDED SINGLE TRACK

Those looking for solitude and the magic of a quiet classic ski in the forest will enjoy the great single track trails tucked in between the double track network. These trails entail little climbing. The most secluded of them is Rockslide, which forms a scenic loop past the warming hut at the Biathlon range.
